Clear, concise overview of your paper. What was your research question/objectives? What will you be arguing, what were your goals, rationale? Why is it important?

Context

Summarise research & policy related to the topic. Identify gaps in the literature. Is it topical? National or International? Include references.

Methodology

How did you gather & analyse data? Were there limitations? Who was your sample? Sample size? Stay specific to *your* study, avoid generic discussions of methods & approaches. Include references.
